#### head

Round 1: Using lemon yarn, make a magic ring for 6 sts, sl st in first st. (6 sts).

**Round 2:** 1 ch,


**Round 3:** 1 ch, \*1 dc in first st, 2 dc in next st\* six times, sl st into first st. (18 sts).

**Round 4:** 1 ch, 1 dc in ea st around, sl st into first st. (18 sts).

**Round 5:** 1 ch, 1 dc work 2 dc into ea st. in ea st around, sl st

#### **MAGIC RING**


The magic ring is an easy way of beginning to work in the round. It is often used when making amigurumi toys



1 Make a large loop by putting the yarn tail behind the working yarn.



With your hook, draw the working yarn through the loop, so you have one loop on the hook.



3 ch (counts as first tr).tr into the loop, crocheting over the tail.



Continue to work as many trs as needed 4 into the loop. Once finished, untwist the tail if necessary then pull to close the loop.

into first st. (18 sts). Round 6: Change to lime, work in front loops only, 1 ch, \*1 dc in first two sts, 2 dc in next st\* six times, sl st into first st.

(24 sts) Round 7: In both loops, 1 ch, six times \*1 dc in first three sts, 2 dc in next st\*, sl st into first st. (30 sts). **Round 8:** 1 ch, \*1 dc in first four sts. 2 dc in next st\* six times, sl st into first st. (36 sts).

**Round 9:** 1 ch, \*1 dc in first five sts, 2 dc in next st\* six times, sl st into first st. (42 sts). **Round 10:** 1 ch, 1 dc in ea st around, sl st into first st. (42 sts). **Round 11:** 1 ch, 1 dc in ea st around. sl st into first st. (42 sts). If using safety eyes, add them here.

Round 12: 1 ch, \*1 dc in first five sts, dc2tog\* six times, sl st into first st. (36 sts).

Round 13: 1 ch, \*1 dc in first four sts, dc2tog\* six times, sl st into first st. (30 sts).

Round 14: 1 ch, \*1 dc in first three sts, dc2tog\* six times, sl st into first st. (24 sts).

**Round 15:** 1 ch, \*1 dc in first two sts, dc2tog\* six times, sl st into first st. (18 sts). Add toy stuffing.

**Round 16:** 1 ch, \*1 dc in first st, dc2tog\* six times, sl st into first st. (12 sts). Round 17: 1 ch,

\*dc2tog\* six times. (6 sts). Fasten off and sew up the opening.

#### ears front

make 2

Round 1: Using lemon yarn, make a magic ring for 6 sts. (6 sts).

Round 2: Work 2 dc into ea st. (12 sts). Round 3: Change to lime, \*1 dc in first st, 2 dc in next st\* six

times. (18 sts). **Round 4:** \*1 dc in first two sts, 2 dc in next st\* six times.

(24 sts). Fasten off.

#### ears back

make 2 Round 1: Using lime yarn, make a magic ring for 6 sts. (6 sts). Round 2: Work 2 dc into ea st. (12 sts). **Round 3:** \*1 dc in first st, 2 dc in next st\* six times. (18 sts).

**Round 4:** \*1 dc in first two sts, 2 dc in next st\* six times. (24 sts).

Fasten off.

#### making up

Place the two halves together and either sew or join with a row of sl st. Sew to the head, at either sides, embroider face, following the images for guidance. If required, use safety eves or beads as alternatives.

#### tail

Round 1: Using lime yarn, make a magic ring for 6 sts. (6 sts). Round 2-34: Work 1 dc in ea st around. (6 sts). Stop once the tail is as long as required and fasten off. Insert pipe cleaner

into the tail instead of stuffing.

#### body

Start in blue (trouser colour).

Round 1: Make a magic ring for 6 sts. (6 sts).

Round 2: Work 2 dc into ea st. (12 sts). **Round 3:** \*1 dc in first st, 2 dc in next

st\* six times. (18 sts). **Round 4:** \*1 dc in first 2 st, 2 dc in next st\* six times (24 sts)

Round 5: 1 dc in ea st around. (24 sts). Round 6: \*dc2tog,

1 dc in ea next 10 sts\* twice. (22 sts). Round 7: Change to

lime, \*dc2tog, 1 dc in ea next 9 sts\* twice. (20 sts)

Round 8: \*dc2tog, 1 dc in next 8 sts\* twice. (18 sts)

Round 9: dc2tog, 1 dc in ea rem st. (17 sts).

Round 10: dc2tog, 1 dc in ea rem st. (16 sts)

Round 11: dc2tog, 1 dc in ea rem st. (15 sts).

**Round 12**: 1 dc in ea st around. (15 sts). Round 13: dc2tog, 1 dc in ea rem st. (14 sts).

Round 14: dc2tog, 1 dc in ea rem st. (13 sts).

Round 15: dc2tog, 1 dc in ea rem st. (12 sts). Add toy stuffing, fasten off, sew to the head.

#### hands

make 2

Round 1: Using lemon yarn, make a magic ring for 6 sts. (6 sts)

Round 2: Work 2 dc into ea st. (12 sts).

Round 3: \*1 dc in first st, 2 dc in next st\* six times. (18 sts).

Round 4: To make a thumb: 4 ch, start second ch from hook, 1 dc in ea rem ch. Fold the circle in half as if sewing up, leave a small gap to use as beginning for arms, sl st into the other side of the circle. Work 5 dc around the gap - this is the beginning of the arm.

**Rounds 5-17:** 1 dc in ea st around. (5 sts).

Fasten off, add a piece of pipe cleaner instead of stuffing into the arm and attach to the body.

make 2 Round 1: Using lemon yarn, make a magic ring for 6 sts (6

Round 2: Work 2 dc into ea st.(12 sts).
Round 3: \*1 dc in first st, 2 dc in next st\* six times. (18 sts).
Round 4: \*1 dc in first 2 sts, 2 dc in next st\* six times. (24 sts).
Round 5: To make a big toe: 5 ch, start

second ch from hook,

1 dc in ea rem ch. As with hands, fold the circle in half, leaving a small gap to use as beginning for legs, sl st into the other side of the circle. Work 7 dc around the gap – this is the beginning of the leg. **Round 6-10:** 1 dc in ea st around. (7 sts). **Round 11-17:** 

Round 6-10: 1 dc ea st around. (7 sts). Round 11-17: Change to blue colour, 1 dc in ea st around. (7 sts). Fasten off, add a piece of pipe cleaner instead of stuffing into the leg and attach to the body. **t-shirt** 

#### make 2

24 ch, start third ch from hook.

Row 1: 1 tr in ea st along. (22 sts).

**Row 2-4:** Turn work, 2 ch (counts as a st), 1 tr in ea st. (22 sts).

**Row 5:** Starting from last st of Row 4, 7 ch, start third ch from hook, 1 tr in ea rem

ch, then 1 tr in ea rem st until you reach the end of the row, add 5 sts using extended tr. (32 sts).

Row 6: Turn work, 2 ch (counts as a st), 1 tr in ea st. (32 sts). Fasten off. Sew the sides together or join using sl st, leaving a gap for the head to fit through. Attach the tail to the
