GRACY BALLERINA

Practise and perfect amigurumi by making Irene Strange's happy hippo



Look at her twirl! With a bouncy yellow tutu and her favourite stripy ensemble, our dancing hippo loves nothing more than prancing about and bounding through the air to her favourite music. She can dance for hours without even realising how the time has flown. If you love the magical possibilities of amigurumi, Gracy will help you master the basic stitches that allow you to create such wonderful creations. After all, practice does make perfect!

HEAD **AND BODY**

Using 3.75mm hook and Forgetme-not Blue make a magic ring, work 6dc into ring. Six sts

Rnd 1: 2dc in each st to end. 12 sts

Rnd 2: (2dc in next st, 1dc) to end. 18 sts

Rnd 3: (2dc in next st, 2dc) to end. 24 sts

Rnd 4: (2dc in next st, 3dc) to end. 30 sts

Rnds 5-10: 1dc in each st to end **Rnd 11:** (2dc in next st, 14dc) to

end. 32 sts **Rnds 12-13:** 1dc in each st to end

Rnd 14: (2dc in first st, 15dc) to end. 34 sts

Rnds 15-16: rep Rnds 12-13 Work in foll two-rnd stripe sequence: (Snowdrop White, Iris Blue) four times,

Snowdrop White **Rnd 17:** (2dc in next st, 16dc) to end. 36 sts

Rnd 18 and every even-numbered

rnd: 1dc in each st to end

Rnd 19: (2dc in next st, 17dc) to end. 38 sts

Rnd 21: (2dc in next st, 18dc) to end. 40 sts

Rnd 23: (2dc in next st, 19dc) to end. 42 sts

Rnd 25: (2dc in next st, 20dc) to end. 44 sts

Rnd 27: (2dc in next st, 21dc) to end. 46 sts

Rnd 29: (2dc in next st, 22dc) to end. 48 sts

Rnd 31: (2dc in next st, 23dc) to end. 50 sts

Rnd 33: (2dc in next st, 24dc) to end. 52 sts

Rnd 34: 1dc in each st to end Change to Iris Blue

Rnd 35: (2dc in next st, 25dc) to end. 54 sts

Rnds 36-42: 1dc in each st to end **Rnd 43:** (dc2tog, 7dc) to end. 48 sts

Rnd 44: (dc2tog, 6dc) to end. 42 sts Rnd 45: (dc2tog,

5dc) to end. 36 sts Rnd 46: (dc2tog, 4dc) to end. 30 sts **Rnd 47:** (dc2tog,

3dc) to end. 24 sts Stuff, insert safety eyes

Rnd 48: (dc2tog, 2dc) to end. 18 sts Rnd 49: (dc2tog, 1dc) to end. 12 sts

Rnd 50: (dc2tog) to end. Six sts Fasten off

NOSE

Using 3.75mm hook and Forgetme-not Blue make a magic ring, work 6dc into ring. Six sts

Rnds 1-4: rep Rnds 1-4 of Head and Body. 30 sts

Rnd 5: (2dc in next st, 4dc) to end. 36 sts

Rnds 6-9: 1dc in each st to end Fasten off, leaving a long tail

LEG

Make two

Using 3.75mm hook and Snowdrop White make a magic ring, work 8dc into ring. Eight sts

Rnds 1-2: 1dc in each st to end Change to Forgetme-not Blue

Rnd 3: 1dc in each st to end Change to Snowdrop White

Rnd 4: rep Rnd 3 Change to Forgetme-not Blue

Rnds 5-9: 1dc in each st to end Fasten off

ARM

Make two

Using 3.75mm hook and Forgetme-not Blue make a magic ring, work 7dc into ring. Seven sts

Rnds 1-4: 1dc in each st to end Work in foll two-rnd stripe sequence: (Iris Blue, Snowdrop White) twice

Rnds 5-12: 1dc in each st to end Fasten off

EAR

Make two

Using 3.75mm hook and Forget-me-not Blue make a

magic ring, work 6dc into ring. Six sts

Rnds 1-2: 1dc in each st to end Fasten off

TUTU

Using 3.75mm hook and Daffofil Yellow make 56ch, join with a sl st to first ch to form a ring

Rnd 1: 1ch, 1dc in each ch to end, join with a sl st to first st

Rnd 2: 2ch (does not count as a st), working in back loops only 3tr in each st to end. 168 sts

Rnd 3: working in front loops only of Rnd 1 work 3tr in each st to end Rnd 4: working along other side of starting ch 3tr in each st to end Fasten off

TO MAKE UP

Sew in ends. Sew hole at end of Head and Body closed. Stuff Nose. Sew below eves above first Snowdrop White rnd and shape into a rough square. Stuff Legs. Sew to bottom of Body. Sew Arms to Body. Sew Ears to top of head. Using Snowdrop White embroider a big smile. Using Forget-menot Blue embroider nostrils (see Great Advice panel). Sew Tutu onto body below stripes

Great Advice

A NOSE FOR IT

To give your hippo raised nostrils, work two long stitches into the nose approximately 3cm apart then wrap each one in a number of short stitches
