Spirit
yarn kit
stuffing, safety eyes,
tapestry needle

stitches used

Slip stitch (sl st)
Double crochet (dc)
Double crochet two
together (dc2tog)

SIZE

Height: 21cm



The clever construction of Irene Strange's amigurumi bunny means that there is minimal sewing together to do at the end – good news for those of us who aren't so keen on this final task. This is because the ears and head are worked as one, as are the legs and body, leaving just the arms and embellishments to add on. It only involves three easy stitches, so if you're new to toy-making this is a great project to try.

first ear

* Using 5.5mm hook and Dusky Pink make a magic ring, work 6dc into ring. Six sts

Rnd 1: 2dc in each st to end. 12 sts

Rnds 2-8: 1dc in each st to end *

Fasten off

second ear

Work as for First Ear from * to *

Place both Ears side by side. 24 sts in total

head

Note: first rnd of Head is worked into last rnd of both Ears

Rnd 1: cont in Dusky Pink work 1dc in each st to end. 24 sts

Rnd 2: (3dc, 2dc in next st) to end. 30 sts

Rnds 3-6: rep Rnd 1 four times

Rnd 7: (3dc, dc2tog) to end. 24 sts

Rnd 8: (2dc, dc2tog) to end. 18 sts

Insert safety eyes

Rnd 9: (1dc, dc2tog) to end. 12 sts

Rnd 10: (dc2tog) to end. Six sts

Fasten off

first leg

* Using 5.5mm hook and Dusky Pink make a magic ring, work 6dc into ring. Six sts

Rnd 1: (2dc in next st, 2dc) to end. Eight sts

Rnds 2-3: 1dc in each st to end

Change to Baby Pink

Rnds 4-5: rep Rnds 2-3 *

Fasten off

second leg

Work as for First Leg from * to *

Place both Legs side by side. 16 sts in total

body

Note: first round of Body is worked into last rnd of both Legs

Rnd 1: cont in Baby Pink work 1dc in each st to end. 16 sts

Rnd 2: (2dc in next st, 7dc) to end. 18 sts

Rnds 3-4: 1dc in each st to end

Rnd 5: (dc2tog, 7dc) to end. 16 sts

Rnd 6: (dc2tog, 6dc) to end. 14 sts

Rnd 7: (dc2tog, 5dc) to end. 12 sts

Rnd 8: (dc2tog, 4dc) to end. Ten sts

Fasten off



safety first

If you intend to use this bunny as a toy for a baby or small child, ensure safety eyes are used and that all elements are securely stitched on

arm

Make two

Using 5.5mm hook and Dusky Pink make a magic ring, work 6dc into ring. Six sts

Rnds 1-3: 1dc in each st to end

Change to Baby Pink

Rnds 4-9: 1dc in each st to end

Fasten off

cheek

Make two

Using 5.5mm hook and Baby Pink make a magic ring, work 6dc into ring, join with a sl st to first st. Six sts

Fasten off

to make up

Stuff Head and Ears. Sew up gap between ears if necessary. Stuff Body and Legs and sew to Base of Head. Stuff Arms and sew to Body. Sew Cheeks to face. Using Baby Pink make a

pom-pom tail and sew to back of Body.

Using Slate Grey embroider a nose and mouth. Using Linen White embroider a dividing line between Head and Body and Body and Legs. Embroider two white buttons

crochet clever

This bunny is classed as an amigurumi pattern as it features a large head, exaggerated facial features and is made in the round using double crochet
