BACK AND FRONTS

(in one piece)

NOTE: worked from bottom edge of back over shoulders and down fronts

Using 5mm hook, make 55 (58, 61) ch □ Row 1: 1dc in second ch from hook, 1dc in each ch to end, turn. 54 (57, 60) sts

 \square Row 2: 1ch (does not count as a st throughout), idc in dc to end, turn Rep Row 2 until work meas 42 (45, 49) cm, ending after a WS row

SHAPE RIGHT NECK

- ☐ Row 1: 1ch, 1dc in next 20 (21, 22) de turn
- \square Row 2: 1ch, 1dc in each dc to end. turn
- ☐ Rep Row 2 twice more ☐ Row 5: 1ch, 1dc in each dc to last
- dc, 2dc in last dc. 21 (22, 23) sts
- □ Row 6: 1ch, 1dc in each dc to end ☐ Rep Rows 5-6 three times, then
- Row 5 once more. 25 (26, 27) sts \square Row 14: 1ch, 2dc in first dc, 1dc in
- each dc to end. 26 (27, 28) sts ☐ Row 15: as Row 5. 27 (28, 29) sts
- \square Row 16: 5 (6, 7) ch, 1dc in second ch from hook, 1dc in next 3 (4, 5) ch, 2dc in first dc. 1dc in each dc to end. 32 (34, 36) sts
- Rep Row 2 until work meas 42 (45, 49) cm from beg of neck shaping
- ☐ Cut yarn and fasten off

SHAPE LEFT NECK

- ☐ Row 1: with RS of work facing and leaving centre 14 (15, 16) sts on back neck edge unworked, rejoin yarn to next st, 1ch, 1dc in same place, 1dc in each dc to end. 20 (21,
- ☐ Rows 2-4: 1ch, 1dc in each dc
- \square Row 5: 1ch, 2dc in first dc, 1dc in each dc to end. 21 (22, 23) sts
- □ Row 6: 1ch, 1dc in each dc to end ☐ Rep Rows 5-6 three times, then
- Row 5 once more. 25 (26, 27) sts \square Row 14: 1ch, 1dc in each st to last dc. 2dc in last dc. 26 (27, 28) sts
- □ Row 15: 1ch, 2dc in first st, 1dc in each dc to end. 27 (28, 29) sts
- ☐ Row 16: as Row 14. 28 (29. 30) sts
- \square Row 17: 5 (6, 7) ch, 1dc in second ch from hook. 1dc in each ch and dc to end. 32 (34, 36) sts
- ☐ Rep Row 2 until work meas 42 (45, 49) cm from beg of neck shaping
- ☐ Cut yarn and fasten off

SLEEVES

NOTE: worked from top to cuff Using 5mm hook, make 51 (57, 63) ch

- ☐ Row 1: 1dc in second ch from hook, 1dc in each ch to end. 50 (56, 62) sts
- \square Row 2: 1ch (does not count as a st throughout), 1dc in each dc to end
- ☐ Rep Row 2 a further 2 (4, 6) times \square Dec one st at each end of foll fifth row, then every foll fourth row until 36 (42, 48) sts
- ☐ Rep Row 2 until work meas 19.5 (24.5, 26.5) cm, ending after a WS row
- \square Next row: 1ch, 1dc in front loop only of each dc to end
- ☐ Working through both loops as normal, rep Row 2 three times, do not turn after last row
- \square Work one row of crab st (see Special Abbreviations)
- ☐ Fasten off

HOOD

Using a 5mm hook, make 49 (51, 53) ch

- \square Row 1: 1dc in second ch from hook, 1dc in each ch to end. 48 (50,
- \square Row 2: 1ch (does not count as a st throughout), 1dc in next 23 (24, 25) dc, 2dc in each of next two dc, 1dc in each dc to end. 50 (52, 54) sts
- \square Row 3: 1ch, 1dc in each of next 24 (25, 26) sts, 2dc in each of next two dc, 1dc in each dc to end. 52 (54,
- □ Row 4: 1ch, 1dc in next 25 (26, 27) sts, 2dc in each of next two dc, 1dc in each dc to end. 54 (56, 58) sts
- \square Row 5: 1ch, 1dc in each dc to end ☐ Rep Row 5 a further 21 times
- ☐ Cut yarn and fasten off

SHAPE TOP OF HOOD

- ☐ With RS facing and leaving first 18 (19, 20) sts unworked, rejoin yarn to next dc, 1ch, 1dc in same place, 1dc in next 17dc, turn
- \square Next row: 1ch, 1dc in each dc
- \square Rep last row 17 (18, 19) times ☐ Cut yarn and fasten off



TOGGLE BANDS

(make two)

Using a 5mm hook, make 21ch □ Row 1: 1dc in second ch from hook, 1dc in each ch to end. 20 sts \square Row 2: 1ch (does not count as a st throughout), 1dc in each dc to end \square Row 3: 1ch, 1dc in next dc, 3ch, miss three dc, 1dc in each dc to end \square Row 4: 1ch, 1dc in next 6dc, 3dc in 3-ch sp, 1dc in last dc □ Row 5: 1ch, 1dc in each dc to end,

- do not turn ☐ Work one row of crab st working
- one st in each dc, 6dc evenly spaced into row ends, 20dc along foundation ch and 6dc up opposite short edge
- ☐ Cut yarn and fasten off

To make up

Set in Sleeves matching centre of foundation ch to centre of side edge of coat at shoulder. Fold coat in half with RS together and sew side and underarm seams. Weave in all ends. Turn coat right way out and fold cuffs back along ridge, three rows from edge. Stitch foundation row of Hood to neck edge of coat, then turn inside out and sew two top seams. Overlap fronts with right over left for a girl and left over right for a boy, and stitch button bands in place. Sew on wooden toggle buttons to correspond with buttonholes. On inside neck, make a button loop with chain stitches and attach button fastening on top corner **LK**

Counting down

On the sleeves, the pattern directs you to decrease one stitch at each end of the row. To do this, you need to work dc2tog. Here's how you do it:

* Insert your hook into the next stitch, wrap the yarn around the hook and pull through the stitch *. You will now have two loops on your hook. Repeat from * to * once more, so you have three loops on your hook. Wrap the yarn around the hook again and pull through all three loops.
